This past month we focused on the days of Lent & Holy Week. We broke down scripture & each day and their meanings to us as Lutherans. Here several kids at KICKS made beeswax candles, as we lit the candles in darkness we talked about Jesus being the light of the world.

The people that walked in darkness have seen a great light: they that dwell in the land of the shadow of death, upon them hath the light shined. Isaiah 9:2

I was a stranger and you welcomed me (Matthew 25:35c)

Imagine if you will for a moment that you've arrived at church for worship and as you're walking toward the door, you see someone you don't know. What do you do? Do you greet them warmly? Stare at them coldly? Or just quickly walk in the door without saying anything and hoping they don't try to engage you in any type of conversation?

Or what about this scenario; you're in the door, you've said hello to the usher and picked up a copy of the bulletin and head over to your normal spot only to find that there's someone else already sitting there. Someone you don't know. A stranger! What do you do now? Greet them warmly and welcome them, maybe ask them if they have any questions about the service? Do you stare at them and then walk off in a huff and go sit somewhere else? Or do you simply tell them that they need to move because that's your spot? Now, what if that person is wearing jeans and a sweatshirt that have seen better days? Or has pink hair? Or tattoos? Or all of it? What if that person has a companion animal?

How we treat those who are strangers to us can tell someone a lot about not only who we are as a congregation, but who we are as children of God. What do we do to make people feel welcome among us? Is there something more that we can do? Whether that stranger is someone who just happened to stop in on their way through town, new to the area and looking for a place to feel welcome or not so new and simply needing to connect or even reconnect with a loving God; their first impression begins even before they walk in the door.

And before you get too worried about where this is going, I can assure you that even in the short time that I've been here I haven't seen any signs that our congregation is any type of an exclusive club that requires proof of family association going back at least three generations before we acknowledge your presence. But even the most welcoming congregation should look at what they do for those new faces and even those faces we haven't seen in a while to let them know that they are welcome, and we are blessed to have them with us, even if it's only once.

That welcome might mean simply saying hello, explaining something in the bulletin or making sure someone knows how to get to the restroom. And even if they're simply passing through, they need to feel that they're welcome back the next time they're passing through. We need to remember that it is through our hands, our smiles, and our words that we not only welcome people to join us in worship but welcome them into God's love.

And we do this, not because we just want a full church, but because our calling is to love God and love people. We reach them with love, bring them with grace, teach them the truth and send them out to share God's love with the world, so that others may feel the same welcome that they were given.

And the King will answer them, 'Truly, I say to you, as you did it to one of the least of these my brothers, you did it to me.' (Matthew 25:40)

PASTOR PICH CHIM & ALWM CAMBODIA

Missions

Cambodia has a population of nearly 17 million people, with 18 different people groups. It is 83%

Buddhist and only 2% Christian. The country is still recovering from the devastation wrought by Pol Pot and the Khmer Rouge from 1975-1979, and the subsequent civil war that extended into the 1990's. In contrast to its neighbors, Cambodia has a constitutional monarchy with freedom of religion. there is great opportunity for ministry! Currently ALWM Cambodia includes more than 12 ministries including house churches, the Island Mission School, and the new mission school in Preh Vihear. In May 2023, we dedicated the

new school in Preh Vihear Province, which has 160+ students in grades 6-9. In addition, there are 50 cell groups in a neighboring country. Cell group ministry, as well as children and youth ministry are all very effective and bearing fruit, as does their Rice and Wells ministry. ALWM sponsored the first national youth gathering for ALWM Cambodia in 2018, and the second one will be in November, 2023.
