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"And he told this parable: "A man had a fig tree planted in his vineyard, and he came seeking fruit on it and found none. And he said to the vinedresser, 'Look, for three years now I have come seeking fruit on this fig tree, and I find none. Cut it down. Why should it use up the ground?' And he answered him, 'Sir, let it alone this year also, until I dig around it and put on manure. Then if it should bear fruit next year, well and good; but if not, you can cut it down." (Luke 13:6-9)

By this point, we are well past the beginning of the year, but if I may confess something--it's taken me this long to think about my New Year's resolutions. And just for fun, I thought I'd share them with you, so for 2025 I want to:

Think about exercising more. Think about eating right. Think about better managing my time.

Well, I'm done thinking about it! Woohoo! I finally completed a set of resolutions! Now, we may joke about making resolutions, but the new year seems to bring with it certain feelings that are almost universal. It's not just a number on a calendar for a lot of people, but instead it represents a boundary, a very real separation between what was and what can be.

The beginning of the year brings out our intense desires for the future and our commitments to change, whatever that change entails. Our preference is usually a set of "resolutions" aimed at working harder for whatever it is we want or fixing our self-perceived flaws. But if all we have is our ambitions and desire to do better this year and we don't really do anything different than what we did the year before, then we can be like that fig tree that doesn't bear any fruit.

Now I'm not suggesting that we follow the advice in the Gospel literally; after all I believe that we get enough 'manure' dumped on us in our daily lives. Instead, I would suggest that what is being talked about here, what is being proposed is that we should have something in our lives that enriches them and gives us what we need to grow as both people and as followers of Christ.

Some people look at things like resolutions or other self-help or self-improvement routines to make their lives better, to be a better person, but in the end, all these things are essentially depending on something that's broken, to fix what's broken.

When we seek to do better or be better, all too often we start by depending on ourselves to get the job done. Now if we could do something like that—depend solely on ourselves—then why would we be looking at all those outside things for? Things like the exercise classes, the workout videos, or the new diets guaranteed to make you a new person and all the other 'stuff' that we hope will make us feel better about ourselves.

But did you notice that it wasn't the fig tree that was suggesting to the man what to do? After all, whatever the fig tree had been doing for itself for the last three years hadn't made any differences. All that time of trying to do for itself and what did it have to really show—no fruit and a frustrated landowner that was ready to add it to the woodpile.

The start of the year is a time for new beginnings, second chances and doing things differently. And with God, every day can be a time for those new beginnings and second chances. We just need to open ourselves up to the efforts of the master gardener and be patient as the seeds of faith are planted, watered and cared for. And in the fullness of time, we may just be surprised at not only what grows in our own lives, but what may also spill into the lives of others who may just be looking for their lives to be made new in Christ.

As far as my resolutions go, I think I'll take another look at mine and maybe see if I can't find some help with taking out the thinking about part and try to add a little more doing. After all, I've got the support I need for all things mind, body and spirit in my Lord and Savior. And so do each and every one of you! So let's see what happens in the coming year as we not only think, but do, as we grow and produce good fruit, in the name of Christ!
