"The king will answer, "Whenever you did it for any of my people, no matter how unimportant they seemed, you did it for me."" (Matthew 25:40 CEV)

How often have we heard that "bigger is better," or that we should "go big or go home." If we're honest; probably more often than we would like to think about. But what happens when ideas like this take root in the church and in the hearts of God's people? Now I'm not talking about building size or the number of people in worship; I'm talking about the way we go about our daily lives; how we live our faith.

Let me tell you about a song that came out a while ago. The title of the song didn't make any sense; at least not in any way that we've come to know, especially when you think about those ideas that I asked about—the whole "bigger is better" idea and so many more that go along that same path. The song? It's called 'Dream Small' and it's sung by Josh Wilson. Really; that's what the song is called. Now, I don't know about you, but I was always told that we should dream big! This whole idea of dream small just doesn't sound quite right does it?

But what does all this have to do with Matthew 25:40? We know that Jesus wants us to care for other people; especially those that we don't think about all the time, or who might be different from us or have problems that we find difficult to understand. But it's not easy to do is it? There seem to be so many people in so many places that need help that it gets a little overwhelming at times. We start feeling like we need bigger and bigger programs to make a difference and we get frustrated because we are just one person and can't do it all. We are only one church in a very big world; we can never do what those really big churches do. And once we start down that path, very little ever gets done.

But let's look a little closer at what comes before verse 40—"55 When I was hungry, you gave me something to eat, and when I was thirsty, you gave me something to drink. When I was a stranger, you welcomed me, 36 and when I was naked, you gave me clothes to wear. When I was sick, you took care of me, and when I was in jail, you visited me." 37 Then the ones who pleased the Lord will ask, "When did we give you something to eat or drink? 38 When did we welcome you as a stranger or give you clothes to wear 39 or visit you while you were sick or in jail?""

When you get down to it, these aren't huge, impersonal, corporate run programs designed to completely solve a problem in a short time, these are ongoing, ordinary, personal and very effective signs of God's overflowing and often unexpected love that are done in simple ways by ordinary people just like each and every one of us.

And that's where this song starts to make sense. The chorus tells us—

Dream small

Don't bother like you've gotta do it all

Just let Jesus use you where you are; One day at a time

Live well; Loving God and others as yourself; Find little ways where only you can help

With His great love, a tiny rock can make a giant fall

Dream small

Think about it for a moment; how did Jesus heal those in need? He didn't wave his hands in a grand gesture and declare an entire village cured; he did it one person at a time. Yes he did cure 10 lepers at once in Luke 17, but how many really took notice of what was done for them—one. And while he did feed thousands, he started off with one loaf of bread and two fish.

Now that doesn't mean that there's no room anymore for the big programs and the big efforts and of course the big dreams; we just have to be careful about getting overwhelmed or feeling like there's nothing we can do. We also have to remember that it's often the small things that have the biggest impact on our hearts. So the next time you hear or see a need in this world and start feeling like you have to fix it all yourself, or start feeling like the problem is too big to handle, stop; take a breath and then go out and live a life overflowing with God's love—and dream small!


Schedule of Events
