

But as it is, God arranged the members in the body, each one of them, as he chose. If all were a single member, where would the body be? As it is, there are many members, yet one body. Now you are the body of Christ and individually members of it. (1 Corinthians 12:18-19, 27)

Have you ever gone outside on a clear night and just looked at the stars? And I don't mean looking at them in order to identify them, but simply considered their number and took a moment to imagine the vastness of space that holds them?

What about something a little closer; have you ever thought about people and the fact that there are close to 8.2 billion people currently on earth? And if you really want to get your head spinning about, consider that since the beginning of time, there have been over 117 billion people born. To give you a little bit better idea of this to write it out as a full number it would be 117,000,000,000. That's a lot of people! And even if you find yourself able to wrap you head around a number like that consider that each one is, was and will be distinctly different human beings created by our God.

So where do you fit in with all of this? In the midst of all those people, where do you and I fit? If you start looking really close at the sheer enormity of those numbers, you start to feel very small and insignificant and may even begin to wonder, can we really be created to make a difference in the world?

Back in 2004 an animated movie was released by the name of "The Incredibles." It's about a family of super-heroes who have been forced to hide their 'special' abilities. The primary villain in the movie is a frustrated boy who dreamt about being 'super.' But he's grown up and now wants revenge on those unique individuals he thinks denied him his dream. As part of his plan, he's invented a number of things to give him the powers he never had. But the true intent of all this comes as he comments that when he's old and has had his fun, he'll sell his inventions so that everyone can be a superhero. Now that doesn't necessarily sound so bad, but then he finishes by saying, "*Everyone* can be super! And when everyone's super......*no one* will be."

Don't we all feel like that at times? Not the super-criminal mentality, but the thought that if everyone is special, everyone is unique, then no one is. And if that's how we see ourselves, then just how insignificant do we end up feeling? And once we get there, it's a very short trip to believing the lie that one person in the midst of so many doesn't have the power to make an impact. And I say that this is a lie simply because of all the books, movies and of course very real news stories about individuals who made all the difference in some part of the world. Just imagine what your own life would be like if it hadn't been touched by a few key people who made a difference; who opened your eyes, your heart, your mind and either changed the direction of your life, or even affirmed the path you were one. What would have happened if not for those special, unique people?

God created each and every one of us to be unique and special people. And as a part of that, He gave us unique and special gifts through the Holy Spirit. Those gifts have been a part of us from birth and are an essential element of who we are. And if you're wondering how these gifts are unique when there are SO many people; think about the people you have known in your life. For example, let's look at the gift of teaching. Out of all the teachers you have known, how many of them were *exactly* alike in form, method, technique? The gifts are unique because the people who have been given them are unique.

This is what St. Paul was trying to get the Corinthians to understand in his letter; perhaps some of them thought they were insignificant and unable to change anything. But Paul knew differently, and he wanted them to see the amazing things that can happen when the many gifts of the Spirit are a part of the very special and unique creations that all of you—and the rest of humanity—truly are.

There may be a lot of us—and more are yet to come—but in the light of God's love, the idea of a cartoon villain that if everyone is special, then nobody is, just rings hollow in the presence of the gospel. So, what are you waiting for? God is counting on you to use the gifts that have been given to you. And if you don't, who will? You are, after all, the only one like you in all of creation. From the Council

The church council met Tuesday June 10th. The following points were obtained from the meeting. Vacation Bible School plans are coming together for August and Trinity is possibly joining with Community Christian to partner on VBS. The finale will be at the Club West swimming pool. Kristy Jerke and Rachel Kitch are still seeking volunteers for this event. I am not sure but believe this maybe the first time Trinity has joined with another church to produce Vacation Bible School. Randy Wetzel gave a report from operations. The floor carpet tiles replacement in the educational wing and the bathroom door upgrade will cost around \$25,000. Monies from the Parsonage fund will cover the cost of these upgrades. He also noted that upgrading the playground will be expensive as insurance requires a professionally designed equipment which also has to be installed by professionals. Randy and his fellow volunteers are doing a great job of maintaining our facility. They are also working on getting the handicapped entrance on the west side of the church planned and developed. This primarily has to be coordinated with a concrete construction company. We do not have any estimates for this project to date. A good discussion was noted about replacing the current envelopes with a different type of envelope. Over time the cost has risen substantially. Pastor Jay had suggestions for change which seem very reasonable. I also believe perhaps special envelopes still would be available for Christmas and Easter. Any questions about this can be directed to myself or Pastor Jay.

The financial report was given and was unremarkable.

Finally, I would like to point out that out organists spend a lot of time preparing for our service and we should take the time to thank them. L. T. Fleske

FRIENDSHIP MEAL UPDATE;


The Kitchen Krew met Tuesday, June 24 and prepared 20
