# Behold, I am doing a new thing; now it springs forth, do you not perceive it? I will make a way in the wilderness and rivers in the desert. (Isaiah 43:19)

A little girl noticed that every time her mother cooked a roast she chopped a piece off the end of the roast before putting it in the oven. Intrigued, she asked her mother why she did this.

"Well to be honest, I do it because that's the way my mother always does it" came the reply. "I'm sure she must have some good reason for it."

At the next family gathering, the child decided to satisfy her curiosity. "Grandma, why do you always chop the end off the roast before cooking it?"

"Well to be honest, I do it because that's the way my mother always does it" came the reply. "I'm sure she must have some good reason for it."

A week or so later the little girl was visiting her 90 year old great grandmother. She explained that mummy and grandma always chop the end off the roast before cooking it, but couldn't remember why. Did she know?

"Of course I do!" said Great-grandma. "Imagine the two of them doing that! Why, I only cut the piece off because my pan was too small!"

If you've been in the church for even a little while, you may have come across the phrase, "we've always done it that way." And while on its surface, there's nothing wrong with saying that, it's when you try to go a little deeper or try to look behind the what is done to get to the why it's done.

507 years ago, Martin Luther dared to start digging a little deeper into the why's of a number of things that were going on in the church at the time. It wasn't done maliciously. It wasn't done because Luther thought he was right and everyone else was wrong. It certainly wasn't done to start a new church. Luther's 95 Theses, the document that for many of us marks the beginning of the Reformation, was simply a request to start a conversation, to debate the state of the church and what direction it seemed to be heading.

Of course, it wasn't received that way by some of the people in authority at the time. Sort of like when all of those strange things that Jesus was saying about God's kingdom and how we were supposed to treat one another wasn't received all that well by the religious authorities of his time. But in both instances, the Gospel would not be held in check by anyone holding earthly authority.

So is it wrong to question why we do things the way we do? Should we question those in authority when we feel that we may be headed in the wrong direction? I believe the lives of both Martin Luther and Jesus would give you an answer to both of those questions. Asking good questions in a respectful manner has always been a good way to learn; even when we don't agree with the answer.

But there seems to be a growing phenomenon in our culture, both inside and outside the church. Well-meaning people, who simply want to have a discussion; who want to ask challenging questions and explore deeper answers are in danger of being labeled as divisive or hateful. And yet, we seem to keep asking questions, especially if we don't like the answers. But again, isn't that what makes for a good debate and a good opportunity for learning?

It is my prayer that the church will continue to learn, and grow in faith and service to our loving God. But that will only be if the church (all of us) is willing to take the time and ask some hard questions of itself when they are needed. And while there will be times when it feels like we're wandering in the wilderness, we only need to ask God to open our eyes, and look to see where He has set our path as we continue in the life giving and reforming newness of God's grace, mercy and love.
