“Do not lay up for yourselves treasures on earth, where moth and rust destroy and where thieves break in and steal, but lay up for yourselves treasures in heaven, where neither moth nor rust destroys and where thieves do not break in and steal. For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also.”—Matthew 6:19-21

During some of my travels, I talked to someone who is an occasional church attender. At one time, he had attended worship at a church a few blocks from where he lives. This particular church has an interesting mix in their worship style. They sing traditional hymns as well as more contemporary ones; and while it is a Lutheran church and they have a liturgy, you won't find anything quite like it in our worship books. I asked him what he thought of the service and the message. He told me that while he enjoyed the service, he was a little concerned because this time the pastor talked about money and possessions and having a lot of 'stuff.' And yes, the message was based on the same text you see at the top of the page. It would seem that he stumbled on what may be close to a universal truth within the church in general—If you want to start a lively discussion in the church or perhaps make people uncomfortable—bring up this text or one like it and watch what happens.

However I have seen that you don't have to bring up Bible passages to start some people squirming. Sometimes all you have to do is bring up one word—are you ready for it? Hold on, here it comes...“stewardship.” There; I said it. And believe it or not, some people are going to stop reading at this point. Why? Because for far too many people, stewardship only means one thing—money; and that's not something they're comfortable with. But truth be told, that's only one part of it.

Just for the fun of it, I looked up the definition of stewardship; not the church one, but the dictionary one and this is what I found: the conducting, supervising, or managing of something; especially the careful and responsible management of something entrusted to one's care. Did you see anything specifically about money? I didn't; instead I see something that encompasses our entire lives from the time we are born until the time we die.

Throughout our lives we have been entrusted with so many things; yes, you can count money as one of them (bad pun, I know), but aren't we blessed with so much more? Think about the words of one of our offertory prayers when we say, “Through your goodness you have blessed us with these gifts: our selves, our time, and our possessions.” Did you notice the order? Who we are seems to be more important than what we have and even the time to be who we are is more important than what we have.

But stewardship in the church is a little more than simply taking care of things that have been entrusted to us; it's also about taking care of those things in a way that brings glory to God and gives thanks to the one who gave us everything in the first place. But how do we do that? Well, the theological answer would be to allow God through the Holy Spirit to guide your actions in life in a way that truly brings the Kingdom of God into this world, thereby allowing you to store your treasures in heaven. The shorter and more practical answer is to share. Share yourself and your gifts with the world; in worship; in service; in everything you do. Do you have a warm smile? Share it as an usher or visiting those who can't get to church. Do you have a voice? Share it in singing, in reading the scripture lessons. Do you have a heart for service? Share it in helping with community meals, home communion, or in other outreach programs. When we keep all this to ourselves, we truly are storing our treasures in an earthly container; and we all know what will happen with it someday. But in sharing who you are and what God has blessed you with in the congregation, in the community and with all our neighbors, we entrust those gifts to God and in so doing, bring a bit of heaven here to earth.

Stewardship and being a good steward isn't all about money; and it isn't about what we have to do to be a good Christian. Being a good steward however, is all about what we get to do because of what God in Christ Jesus did for us. Where's your treasure? Is it in an earthly vessel that will eventually crumble into the dust it came from? Or is it out there in the world that God loved enough to give his greatest gift to. Answer that question, and you'll know where your heart is as well.

The Council met on August 20. The different committees gave their reports. Among the highlights was the fact that VBS was a success this year with over 20 children participating and Rachel felt it was very well received.

Krista Smith gave the worship report and that group has been active in that several changes were suggested because of Pastor's illness and the potential problem with pastoral needs for Advent. At this time the worship group will prepare to have services during Advent so arrangements for lectors and others will proceed. This situation will be revisited as we approach November and December.

Ruth Lanterman reported for ministry that three funerals were served by the Lutheran women and 14 home bound individuals received communion. Also ,the quilting group has prepared 36 health kits for Lutheran World Relief and are on track to have 60 quilts completed by October.

Randy Wetzel reported that the area for dropping off individuals with mobility issues was under construction and will soon be available for use. We did discuss expanding this towards the street if it results in individuals having difficulty turning or negotiating that space though he felt that should not be an issue. Markers were placed on the Church grounds for trees that the Terry Stueder family kindly donated -remember two years ago a large storm took out several of the large trees(July2023). Under new business Randy reported that the security system was not functioning and may have been damaged during a recent storm so he has proceeded with replacing it and the bid was near \$7000. I

t is that time of year for a congregational meeting and that will occur on October 19 with ballots going out 2 weeks prior. A nominating committee of Jill Johnson, Chad Jerke, Perry Smith and Len Fleske will meet to discuss openings and suggestions for individuals to fill them. Anyone interested should contact a member of that group.

Finally, a realignment of rooms was discussed and the considerations of each group was discussed. This included the quilting group, TLC, and the youth ministry. The current and proposed room changes were made and it appears that all three groups reached a satisfactory solution that appears to meet the needs of each. The meeting then concluded. L. T. Fleske
